REGULATIONS LAID DOWN BY THE SCOTTISH GOVERNMENT – RURAL DIRECTORATE FOR EXHIBITS IN THE CATTLE SECTION

1. The pasture where cattle are to stand must have been clear of susceptible livestock for 28 days prior to the date of the Show.
2. Sterilised milking units must be provided at the Show and must be suitably disinfected between each cow. If hand milking is practised, the milker must disinfect his hands between each cow.
3. Dams may suckle their calves, but otherwise calves may be fed on reconstituted milk only.
4. Water, milking and grooming points should be clearly marked and used by no other stock.
5. Cattle showing evidence of calving or aborting whilst on the Showground, must be isolated. The DVM should be notified regarding a licence to leave the Showground.
6. No person other than show officials, judges, marshals and the owner or his representatives shall be permitted to enter the Showing.
7. Judges must wash and dry their hands before handling stock in the Showing and an adequate supply of clean water, disinfectant, soap and disposable towels should be provided for this purpose.
8. Exhibitors must comply with instructions notified by SAMU, BCMS and DVM.

GENERAL REGULATIONS for ALL Exhibitors

1. The stock in all Classes must be the bona-fide property of the Exhibitor for at least Thirty Days before the date of the Show, except where stated otherwise.
2. A competitor may show more than one lot in any Class, but cannot enter a lot in one Class and afterwards withdraw it for competition in another, except as stipulated. Classes will be judged in numerical order.
3. Entries must be made in writing, by completing the Membership & Entry Form and lodging this Form, along with the entry money, by 7th July, 2010, with the Secretary. **Should the Secretary be able to take an Entry after that date, Entry Fee will be at DOUBLE NORMAL RATE.**
4. A list of Stock to be exhibited will then be compiled. **No Stock will be allowed to compete which is not included in that list.**
5. Stock attendants must bring same into judging ring when requested to do so by the Stewards. All Stock not in the judging ring when the judging starts will be disqualified and not allowed to compete in the Class being judged. All cattle and horses must be led. All bovine male animals over ten months to be secured by the nose.
6. All Stock Attendants are prohibited from speaking to the Judges, except in answer to questions put. Stewards appointed by the Committee will attend the Judges of the respective Classes of Stock, who will communicate with the Secretary; and all other persons are prohibited from entering the ring on pain of disqualification of their stock.
7. The Stock exhibited will not be distinguished in the Judging Enclosure by the Name of the Breeder, Feeder or Owner until after the Premiums are awarded, but only by Tickets or Numbers to be affixed to each lot, corresponding to the list made up by the Secretary. Catalogue number must be displayed on animal when in judging ring; otherwise it may be disqualified.

8. **Horses and Cattle must be paraded when required by the Stewards, and under their direction. Attendants must be beside their animals fifteen minutes before the hour of parade, and be ready to proceed to the ring immediately on receiving the orders from the Stewards. Infringements of this Rule, or failure of any attendant to obey the orders of the Stewards or Society officials, may incur forfeiture of all or portion of Prize Money. Animals must not leave the Showground until after the Parade except under Vet's instructions.**

9. The Gates of the Showyard will be open at 7 o' clock on the morning of the Show and the different lots must be brought to the ground between that hour and 9 o'clock, except by special permission of the Committee, who will have the entire management of everything connected with the Show.
10. The Judges will begin to view the exhibits at 9 o'clock.
11. Where the Special Rules of any Section are at variance with these General Regulations, the Special Rules will apply.
12. Protests against the awards of the Judges (which on the merits of each exhibit shall be final), or in regard to any matter connected with the Show, must be lodged in writing, with the Secretary, not later than 12 noon on the day following the Show; and the same shall thereafter be disposed of by the committee appointed for that purpose by the Society. All questions as to the validity of the protests lodged shall be determined by the Committee. Each protest must be accompanied by a deposit of £10; and if not sustained the sum deposited may, at the discretion of the Committee, be forfeited to the Society. All decisions of the Committee shall be final, and it shall not be competent for any exhibitor to appeal against such decisions nor to seek redress in respect of them from any other tribunal.
13. The Prizes awarded will be paid in 2010.
14. The Society shall not be liable for any loss, injury or damage which Stock, Implements, or other Exhibits or Individuals may sustain at the Show, or while in the Showfield.
15. The Society would draw the attention of exhibitors to the following: "Any exhibitor winning a trophy must accept full responsibility for any damage occurring to that trophy whilst in their care and possession. Exhibitors should make suitable arrangements through their household insurers, to ensure their interests are protected".
16. In all Sections only First Prize-winners in Single Classes will be eligible to compete in the Championship, but in determining the Reserve Champion the Second Prize-winner of the class from which the Champion has been selected will be allowed to compete.
17. Livestock handlers should be of a suitable age to lead and control exhibits.

PATTERN FOR PREMATURE BABY'S HAT - 3 ply wool

Using size 2¼ mm (12) needles cast on 107 stitches. Work in 1 x 1 rib for 5 cms, ending with a right side row. Proceed in stocking. stitch for 4 cm ending on the right side.

Next row. Purl to end increasing 4 stitches evenly across row (111 stitches).

In stocking stitch., shape crown as follows:

1st row	K1, *K2 tog, K9, rep from * to end.
2nd and every alternate row	Purl
3rd row	K1, *K2 tog, K8, repeat from * to end.
5th row	K1, *K2 tog, K7, repeat from * to end.
7th row	K1, *K2 tog, K6, repeat from * to end.
9th row	K1, *K2 tog, K5, repeat from * to end.
11th row	K1, *K2 tog, K4, repeat from * to end.
13th row	K1, *K2 tog, K3, repeat from * to end.
15th row	K1, *K2 tog, K2, repeat from * to end.
17th row	K1, *K2 tog, K1, repeat from * to end.
19th row	K1, *K2 tog, repeat from * to end.

Run Yarn through remaining stitches, draw up and fasten off.

To make up: Join back seam reversing seam for turn back.
